# **Alan Ingham Memorial Lecture Speakers**

Alan Ingham worked for much of his academic career at Miami University in Ohio as Professor in Sport Studies, before passing away in 2005. His research and teaching both emphasized the ideals of social justice, and he was among the first scholars to apply a critical perspective to the sociology of sport. His seminal textbook co-edited with John Loy - *Sport in Social Development: Traditions, Transitions and Transformations* - became and remained for some time, a go-to text for all undergraduate students in our field, and not just in North America. He also contributed to the early literature on the cultural studies of sport and physical activity, and earned an international reputation for his advocacy of interdisciplinary approaches to sport and physical culture. This memorial lecture, presented annually at each NASSS conference, commenced in 2006, and helps to celebrate his legacy.
