In this way, my vision for NASSS is a space where we can continue to grow as professionals and as individuals.

My vision for NASSS is one that takes seriously our espoused commitments to inclusivity and accessibility. It is not only possible but *necessary* to make NASSS more accessible, including (but not limited to) online/remote participation for the annual meeting.
